JAMESTOWN

Is a neat small market town in the county of Leitrim, distant seventy-four miles west-north-west of Dublin, one from Drumsna, two and a half south-east of Carrick-on-Shannon, eight north-west of Ruskey, and fourteen south-west of Ballynamore. At the south entrance of the town is an arched gateway, which gives it the appearance of having formerly been fortified. Here are the remains of an old castle, said to have been built by Sir Chas. Coote, in the year 1623. This castle experienced various re-

verses during the rebellion of 1641. In 1689 it was taken by the Enniskilleners, who, on the approach of General Sarsfield with superior forces, were obliged to retire to Sligo. In the centre of the town is the Catholic chapel, a small but neat stone edifice; the exterior of which is ornamented with a cross, and the interior with a beautiful altar-piece, representing the crucifixion of our Saviour. Market day is Saturday. The population is about 200.

COACHES, &c.

The Royal Mail from Sligo passes through to Dublin at three in the afternoon—returns at ten in the morning for Sligo.

A Caravan passes from Boyle at ten in the morning through Ruskey and Longford to Fenlic, and, after meeting the Dublin Passage Boat, returns at a quarter past three in the afternoon, and proceeds to Boyle.

Cars may be expressly hired for the conveyance of goods to any part of Ireland.

KILLALA,

A small seaport in the county of Mayo, is pleasantly situated on a bay of the same name, & the south-bank of the Moy. It is distant 127 miles nearly north-west of Dublin, twenty-two north of Castlebar, six north of Ballina, and thirty north of Newport. The bishopric of Achonry in the county of Sligo was united to this see in the year 1607. Here the French invaders landed in 1798, and here the rebels were finally subdued after the surrender of the French at Ballynamuck. To the cathedral church a neat tower and spire were added in 1820. An ancient round tower is still standing in the town 84 feet high, but no record exists to ascertain the date or purpose of its erection. A mile eastward of this place stands Moyne

abbey, now in ruins, built for Dominican friars by the family of the O'Dowdes, in 1412. Not far distant from this are the ruins of Roserke abbey; both are well worth the traveller's notice. The bishop's palace is a modern building, erected in a commanding situation and overlooking the Bay. Here is also a free school, which was founded by the trustees of Erasmus Smyth's charity, and affords education gratis to seventy children. The exports of this town are grain & provisions. A good market is held on Saturday, and there are three annual fairs, viz. on the 28th of May, the 17th of August, and the eighth of November. Population about 2400.

POST OFFICE.—*Post Mistress*, Mrs. Ann Grant. The Dublin mail arrives from Ballina by horse, at six in the morning, and returns at seven the same evening. Office hours from seven in the morning till eleven at night.

COACHES.

The Dublin Mail goes to Dublin every morning, Saturday excepted, at eleven from the coach office, Flood-street, through Loughrea, Ballinafad, Athlone, Most, Kinnegad, Inshel, and Leixlip, and returns through the same towns every day at three in the afternoon to Galway.

The canal coach leaves Conolly's Hotel, Eyre-square, for Loughrea on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at six in the morning, and returns on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at eight in the evening.

GORT

Is a small, improving, post and market town, in the county of Galway, ninety-nine miles west by south of Dublin, eighteen south-east of Galway, twelve south-west of Loughrea, and fifteen north of Ennis. It consists of three principal streets concentrating in the square, where the market is held; it is remarkably clean, the streets are spacious, and the houses well built. The place is the property of Lord Gort, and promises to become a town of considerable bus-

iness. The church is a handsome edifice with a steeple; there is also a neat slated Roman Catholic chapel. Here is a good barrack for a detachment of horse, a court house, where the sessions are held, and a manor court for the recovery of small debts. It has a good market on Saturday, and four fairs in the year, viz: on the 17th of March, the 10th of May, the 11th of August, and the 7th of November. Population about 1860.

POST OFFICE.—*Post Master*, Mr. Michael Tohy. The Dublin mail is despatched at thirty-two minutes past three to Ennis, and returns at five minutes past eight in the morning. The mail to Loughrea every morning at fifty-two minutes past eight, and returns at twenty-five minutes past three in the afternoon. The mail is sent to Burrin on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays, and returns on the same days.
