LOUGHREA,

A Post, market, and fair town in the county of Galway and province of Connaught, is eight miles west by south of Dublin, eighteen south-east of Tuam, and twenty east by south of Galway. The town is pleasantly situated on the banks of a beautiful lake, which is five miles in circumference, and extends over a surface of not less than 1220 acres. This lake is said to be supplied by seven distinct springs, called the seven sisters. Loughrea was formerly garrisoned, and the remains of its walls are yet visible. A new church was erected here in 1821, which is a handsome edifice with a fine steeple; and the Catholic chapel is a good sized building. Here are also the remains of an old castle, and a monastery for Carmelite or white friars, said to have been erected by Richard de Burgh, Earl of Ulster, in the year 1300; and adjoining to it is a very neat chapel. The other public buildings are the two barracks, one for cavalry,

the other for infantry; the linen hall; and the court house, erected in 1821, in which the sessions are held twice a year, and a court for the recovery of debts once a week. The charitable institutions are a dispensary, and several schools for the education of the poor. On the north side of the town is a delightful gravel walk overshadowed by lofty trees; it is the promenade of the place, and for its beauty not exceeded by any in this part of the kingdom. Loughrea is the property of the Earl of Clanrickard, who resides at Portumna. The government of the town is vested in a seneschal. There are no manufactories, but an extensive market is held on Thursday, and another for meat on Saturday. The fairs are on the 11th of February, the 25th and 26th of May, the 20th of August and the 5th of December. Population near 3000.

POST OFFICE, Church-lane.—*Post Master,* Mr. Thos. Clutterbuck. The mail is sent to Dublin daily at two in the afternoon by the Galway mail, and returns daily at twelve. The Gort, and Ennis mails arrive at eleven, and are despatched at a quarter past twelve by horse. Office hours from seven in the morning till eleven at night.

COACHES.

DUBLIN, the Mail, from the Coach-office, Main-street, through Ballinascloe, Athlone, Moat, & Kinnegad, daily at two.

MANOR-HAMILTON,

IN the county of Leitrim. is a small market, post, and fair town, situated in a valley and surrounded by immense rocky mountains; it is 92 miles north west of Dublin, 23 north of Carrick-on-Shannon, 13 south of Ballyshannon, 20 north of Leitrim and 11 east of Sligo. Here are the ruins of an old castle built by Sir Frederick Hamilton in the turbulent times of King Charles I., and immediately after the rebellion of 1641; he was then a lieutenant in the British army, and afterwards received a grant of this manor, and hence the town derives its name. The church, which is at an inconsiderable distance, is a neat stone edifice, built about 50 years; about two years since a handsome lofty spire was added which renders it a great ornament to the town. There are also a Catholic chapel, and two Methodist meeting-houses, all built of fine hewn stone and well slated. In the year 1819 a sessions house was erected here, where

the sessions are held four times a year for civil oills and petty offences; a manor court is also held once a month for the recovery of debts under 20 pounds. The charitable institutions of Manor-Hamilton are a dispensary for the poor supported by the grand jury grant and annual subscriptions; a free school of the London Hibernian Society; and another supported by the interest of 900 pounds, in the 3 per cent stocks, left in perpetuity by Mr. James Masterson; there is also a bequest of 10 pounds yearly, left by Patrick Cullen, esq. grandfather to the present Colonel Cullen, for the use of the poor of this parish. The market day is Thursday; and the fairs are May the 8th, July the 1st, the first Thursday in August, October the 7th, and the first Thursday after the 12th of November.—The population in 1821 was nearly 1700.

POST OFFICE—*Post Master,* Mr. Thomas Corcadden. The Dublin mail leaves at five in the morning, and arrives at 50 minutes past seven in the evening. The Sligo mail is despatched at eight in the evening, and arrives with the Dublin mail. The Enniskillen and Florence-Court by-bags go at five in the morning.
