**COACHES, &c.**  
FROM THE OFFICE, LINES HALL-ST.  
The Sligo Mail Coach, every morning at  
half past nine, through Boyle, Drumana,  
Longford, Rathown and Mullingar, to  
Kingsoad, where it meets the Galway  
Mail to Dublin; and returns by the  
same route to Sligo every afternoon  
at twenty minutes past four.  
N. B. It is in contemplation for a Coach  
soon to start from Sligo, direct to Dub-  
lin and back.

A Car to Boyle, from Ross's Hotel, Old  
Market-street, every Monday, Wed-  
nesday and Friday, at eight in the  
morning; and returns on Tuesdays,  
Thursdays and Saturdays, at three  
in the afternoon. This Car meets a  
Van at Boyle, which proceeds to Kil-  
lishee, whence a packet boat proceeds  
to Dublin.

STROKESTOWN,

IN the county of Roscommon, is a market and post  
town, seventy-two miles west-north-west of Dublin,  
ten north of Roscommon, fourteen south-south-east  
of Boyle, and five south-south-east of Elphin. It is  
the property of Lord Hartland, whose mansion and  
domain adjoin the town. Here are a fine Gothic  
church with a spire, erected in 1821; a sessions-  
house, in which the sessions are held twice a year for  
the recovery of debts; a Catholic chapel; and a dis-  
pensary, supported by subscription. Strokestown  
with its white houses has a very cheerful appearance

at a distance, nor is the stranger disappointed when  
he enters the place, as the streets are clean and spar-  
cious. At the distance of a mile from this town are  
held the annual fair and races of Ballinacul, which  
commence on the 27th of August, and continue for a  
week; the fair is celebrated for the sale of cattle,  
yarn, &c. The market day of Strokestown is Friday,  
for corn, provisions, &c. &c. and there are four fairs  
in the year; viz: on the 18th of May, the 15th of  
June, the 19th of October, and the 16th of Novem-  
ber. Population about 1500.

teen miles distant, where the Sligo and  
Dublin Mail passes daily.  
Cars to Richmond Harbour, daily at ten,  
to meet the Dublin Packet and return  
at four in the afternoon.

SWINEFORD,

IN the county of Mayo, is a market and post town,  
one hundred and ten miles north-west of Dublin,  
fifteen miles north-east of Castlebar, twelve south-  
south-east of Ballina, fourteen north of Clare, and  
four north-west of Balhaunis. It is the property of Sir  
Wm. Brabzon, who resides here, and who, within  
the last few years, has greatly improved the place.  
Swineford derives its name from a fordable stream,  
which passes by the town, and near which was  
formerly held a considerable market for pigs. The  
town stands on an elevated situation, and the aspect  
of the neighbourhood country is extremely wild and  
bleak. Here is a small Gothic church with a tower,

called St. Mary's, and built in 1810. Petty sessions  
are held once a week over the market-house, and a  
new school house will shortly be finished under the  
auspices of the London Hibernian Society. The new  
line of road, making from Tolmahurry near Long-  
ford to Ballina, will pass through this town and be of  
considerable advantage to its market, which is held  
on Tuesday for pigs, provisions, corn, &c. The fairs  
are held on the 1st of February, the 17th of March,  
the 20th of May, the 2nd of July, the 18th of August,  
the 29th of October, and the 18th of December. Po-  
pulation about 660.
