BALLINROBE.

Pigot & Co.'s

a plain neat edifice, but has little else to recommend it to public notice; the incumbent is the very Rev. Thos. John Burgh, Dean of Cloyne, and the Rev. Robt. Potter is Curate. The Roman Catholic Chapel in Bridge-street is tolerably well and substantially built; the duty is at present performed by the Rev. Michael Green. The Market and Court House is a plain stone building, in which are held quarter sessions, besides weekly petty sessions. Ballinrobe possesses great claims to antiquity, and was formerly considered of much more importance than it is now; as a

garrison-town it has long been distinguished, and is at present the head quarters for a regiment of cavalry. The barracks (once the residence of Lord Tyrrawly) stand unequalled, for their beautiful, healthy, convenient and romantic situation on the banks of the river Robe, from which the town derives its name. The market is held every Monday, and is generally well attended; a linen market is also about to be established, which will be held on the same day. Ballinrobe has a fair on Whit-Tuesday, and another on the 5th of December. The population is about 1000.

WESTPORT,

IN the county of Mayo, is a small seaport, and derives its name from its situation on the western coast. It is at the head of Clew-bay, one hundred and twenty-three miles west of Dublin, eight and a half south-west of Castlebar, twenty-two and a half south-by-west of Ballina, and six south of Newport. The town is seated in a valley, near an English mile from the port; it is extremely clean and rapidly improving. The Marquis of Sligo is sole proprietor of this place; his mansion and domain are extremely beautiful, and a mixture of hill, dale, wood and water render his residence fascinating in the extreme. His library, also, is said to rank among the first private literary collections in Europe. Near the port is that stupendous mountain, called Crough Patrick, or the Rake; whither thousands of the votaries of religion annually resort to do penance for their sins. In the castle domain is a small neat church, and on the mall is a very

extensive Catholic chapel of the Gothic order, built by subscription in 1813. Opposite this chapel are the linen hall, and the court house; both modern buildings. Westport also possesses a good market house, a barrack which overlooks the town and neighbourhood, and schools for the education of the poor. The Marquis of Sligo humanely supports a public hospital here for the benefit of the indigent and distressed. The trade of Westport is much increased within the last few years, and the firm of Patten, Smyth & Co has contributed much to its improvement. The imports are chiefly Iron, salt, timber, &c., and the exports corn, linen, provisions, &c. The market day is Thursday for linen, corn, provisions, &c. &c.; and fairs are held on the 1st of January, the 24th of May, the 6th of August, and the 1st of November. Population about 4,500.
