CARRICK-ON-SUIR,

IN the county of Tipperary, is situated, as its name denotes, on the northern bank of the river Suir, and on the road from Waterford to Limerick; it is distant 10 miles north west from the former, 56 south east from the latter, and 13 east from Clonmel. The situation of this town upon the river renders it a convenient place for exporting the commodities of the neighbourhood, and considerable business is done in the corn, butter, and provision trade. This place was also formerly noted for its manufacture of narrow coarse ratteen cloths, but it has considerably decreased of late years, though they were always of an

excellent quality. The parish church is a building of no particular merit, but the conventual chapel of the Franciscans, in Carrick-beg, is a neat stone building, ornamented with a small square tower, and spires at the angles. The communication between Carrick and Carrick-beg on the opposite side of the river, in the county of Waterford, is by means of a very ancient stone bridge. There is also a very ancient building, called the Castle, now in the occupation of John Wogan, esq. sovereign of the town. The market days are Wednesday and Saturday.

CASHEL

IS an ancient city and post town in the county of Tipperary, distant 76 miles south-west from Dublin, 12 north-west from Clonmel, 10 north-east from Tipperary, 48 north by east from Cork, 28 south by east from Limerick, and 34 miles north-west from Waterford. It is the see of an archbishop, is governed by a mayor, recorder, town-clerk and bailiffs, returns one member to parliament, and is at present represented by Ebenezer John Collett, esq. The parish church, erected on the site of the old church, and dedicated to St. John, is a handsome stone building, with a lofty well formed spire; it was opened for divine service on the 25th of December, 1781. The Catholic chapel in Friar-street is substantial and commodious, the Rev. Dr. John Ryan Dean of Cashel is parish priest, and the Rev. James McDonnell is senior coadjutor. There is also a Methodist chapel on a

small scale. The charitable institutions here are numerous. A charter school was founded in 1751, to which the late archbishop Price subscribed 50 pounds per annum during his life, and by his will bequeathed 300 pounds, the interest of which is applied to the maintenance of the children, the number being limited to 31. It is also assisted by numerous other bequests and annual parliamentary grants. There are also a Roman Catholic school, which was endowed by the late Dr. Wright for the education of the poor of that persuasion, and a poor school for females, which is superintended by six Roman Catholic ladies, residents of the town. There is likewise a school for the education of Protestant children, liberally supported by Dr. Laurance, archbishop of Cashel. A charitable loan society was lately formed, by which necessitous tradesmen are accommodated with sums
