DINGLE,

A SEA port in the county of Kerry and the most side of a peninsula comprising the barony of Corkguin-western town in Europe, is distant 164 miles south by which is 24 miles in length, and eight in breadth; west from Dublin, 21 and a half west by south from on the south it is washed by the bay of Dingle, on the Tralee, 73 south west from Limerick, and 80 miles north by Tralee bay, and shoots like a tongue into the north west from Cork. It is situated on the south Atlantic; it contains about 20 populous parishes; is

remarkable for its fertility, and the manufacture of a species of linen, called Bandle cloth. The harbour is excellent and within three hours' sail of the Atlantic ocean; at the entrance into it there is at low water 30 feet depth, gradually diminishing to not less than 12 feet in any part; the channel is tolerably straight and runs along the western shore. A great field for industry here presents itself to the active and intelligent, as no spot can be better calculated for an extensive corn trade, the home fisheries, the linen manufacture, and the Newfoundland trade. In these branches of commerce, the last in particular, this town enjoys many unrivalled advantages, well worth the attention of the merchant.—The church, lately erected on the site of an ancient abbey dedicated to the Virgin Mary, is destitute of any thing externally ornamental. The curacy is vested in the hands of the Rev. John Goodwin, the tithes of the parish are improper. The Catholic chapel is remarkable for its simplicity and elegance of appearance, and is very capacious; Dr. Thomas Foley is the Roman Catholic rector of this extensive parish. There is in this town a Lancasterian free school, which affords facilities of education to nearly 200 boys of all denominations; it is patronized by the Rev. Dr. Foley, and is liberally supported by the beneficent of the town and neighbourhood. It is in contemplation to form a similar establishment for girls.—The decline, or rather the almost total loss of trade in the west and south west parts of the counties of Cork and Kerry, comprehending a great extent of sea coast with many excellent harbours formed by nature, and favorable to unlimited commerce, is much to be lamented. Of this Dingle is a particularly striking instance; for in the reign of Queen Elizabeth it was a place of trade and consequence much frequented by foreigners, and singularly noticed by Sir Walter Raleigh for its many local advantages; but it is now scarcely known, though well inhabited, and possesses very little commerce. In the neighbourhood a stratum of coal and a copper mine have been discovered, and it is hoped they will prove beneficial to the interest of the town. The market, at which there is an abundant supply of fish, is held every Saturday, and there are annual fairs on the first of May and the fourth of October.

DONERAILE,

DISTANT one hundred and thirteen miles south-west of Dublin, six east-by-north of Mallow, twelve north-east of Kanlurk, and fifteen east of Newmarket, is a market, post and fair town in the county of Cork, and situated in the midst of a populous neighbourhood on the banks of the river Aueg. The church is a plain, though, on the whole, not inelegant structure. The Catholics have a convent and a chapel; there is also a free school. The barrack which accommodates a company of foot, is built on the site of an ancient castle. The park and grounds belonging to Lord Doneraile, and the sublime scenery surrounding this town, draw a concourse of fashionable company during the summer season. It has a market on Saturday, and a fair on the 12th of November.
