DUNGARVAN,

IN the county of Waterford, is a large, populous and well-built borough town and seaport, situate on a bay of the same name, ninety-six miles west-south-west of Dublin, twenty-two west-south-west of Waterford, and forty-two east-north-east of Cork. It is one of the most considerable fishing towns in Ireland, and is remarkable for producing the first apple potatoes in the county. It supplies a great part of the interior of Munster with fresh fish, and is a remarkably cheap town. Here is a barrack for two companies of foot, situated on the site of an old castle erected by King John. This town was incorporated about the

year 1463; its privileges were renewed and its charter confirmed by James I. for the loyalty manifested by the inhabitants during the rebellion fomented in the reign of Queen Elizabeth; it is governed by a sovereign, recorder, and twelve brethren, annually elected. The admiralty of the harbour was formerly vested in the sovereign. The river Colligan runs through the town, and divides it from Abbey-side, where exist the remains of an ancient castle and abbey, in the latter of which are still to be seen some sheeting boards of old Irish oak, which, although but an inch thick, are yet undecayed after a lapse of centuries. The quarter sessions of the peace for the western division of the county are held here in January and April; there is also a manor court held here

by the seneschal, every three weeks, at which debts under 15*l.* may be recovered. The Church has nothing to recommend it but its situation, which is delightful and commands a full view of the bay and harbour. The Duke of Devonshire is principal proprietor and patron, and to his munificence the inhabitants are indebted for a most elegant stone bridge with a causeway upwards of nine hundred feet long, which he most generously gave them toll free. Dungarvon sends one member to Parliament. Saturday and Wednesday are the market days; there are also four annual fairs on the 7th of February, the 22nd of June, the 27th of August, and the 8th of November.
