

of Limerick, 48 north east of Cork, and 8 south of Cashel. It contains an ancient church, which is allowed to be one of the most commodious and handsome country churches in Ireland; but it is to be regretted, that about eighteen years ago, the roof, which was purely Gothic, and corresponded with the venerable tower, was converted into a Grecian one, and the whole building modernized. A Catholic chapel of the Gothic order has been lately erected, which is a great ornament to the town; and the beautiful old abbey, formerly belonging to the Augustinian Friars has been lately fitted up as a chapel. The Presbyterians have also a place of worship. The parish school house is a neat building, and contains two airy well finished school rooms, one for boys and the other for girls, with comfortable apartments for the master; it was erected about two years since, partly by private subscription, and partly by grants from government and the association for the suppression of vice. Here is a convenient barrack, which from the plentiful supply of forage, was found a convenient station for a troop of cavalry, but on account of the

partial repairs in the stables, it was thought advisable to substitute infantry. The town is governed by a sovereign and burgeses, and a tholsel court, one of the oldest chartered in the kingdom, is held every three weeks. It was, though small, formerly a place of strength, being encircled by high walls, and the four entrances into the town were guarded by gates and towers, three of which are at present standing, though not in very good preservation. It stood a siege in the time of Cromwell, and the articles of treaty and capitulation are now in the possession of William Barton, Esq. of Grove, to whom the principal part of the place belongs. Previous to the union it was a borough, and sent two members to the Irish parliament. The town is well supplied with water, but the market, owing to its vicinity to Clonmel, is not equal to the fertility of the surrounding country; it is held on Saturday. There are four fairs annually, viz. on the 20th of April, on the Friday before Trinity Sunday, on the 7th of September and the 21st of November.

KANTURK,

IN the county of Cork, is distant 128 miles south west of Dublin, 26 north west of Cork, 10 west of Mallow, 18 north of Macroom, and 13 south west of Doneraile. It is a post town, through which flow the rivers Allo and Dalluo. The church is entirely destitute of ornament; but there is a commodious Roman Catholic chapel, and a free school founded by the Kildre-street Society. Sessions in future are to be held at this town on the first of June. Not far distant are the remains of a castle, begun in the

reign of Elizabeth by an Irish chieftain named Mac Donnough M'Carthy: the policy of the Queen would not, however, suffer him to finish it; for, when he was on the point of finishing the building, her orders arrived, desiring him to relinquish his ask. It has lately been repaired by order of Lord Egmont. The market is held on Saturday, and there are fairs on the 17th of March, the 4th of May, the 4th of July, the 29th of September, the 4th of November, and the 11th of December.

POST OFFICE.—Post Master, Mr. Stephen Williams. The mails from Dublin and Mallow arrive every Sunday, Wednesday and Friday evening, at a quarter before eight, and depart every Monday, Thursday and Saturday morning at six.
