COACHES.

The nearest place whence there is a public conveyance, is Littleton, distant four miles and a half, from which the Dublin Royal Mail starts at six every morning, and returns on its way to Cork, &c. at eight in the evening.

KILMACTHOMAS,

IN the county of Waterford, is eighty-six miles from Dublin, twelve from Waterford, and on the high road between the latter city and Cork. It is in itself a considerable place, but the surrounding country is highly interesting and picturesque. There was formerly a fine castle here, erected by the family of the Powers. In 1643, Sir Charles Vavasour reduced this castle with many others in the eastern districts of the county. Fairs are held on the 12th of May, the 12th of August, and the 6th of December.

CORK, the Royal Mail daily at ten minutes before eleven through Dunkarreen, Cappoquin, Lismore, Tallow, Youghal, Castle-Martyr, and Middleton, and returns at ten minutes before three.

KILMALLOCK,

A POST and fair town in the county of Limerick, is one hundred and eight miles south-west of Dublin, thirty-four north of Cork, and sixteen south of Limerick. Though now in a ruinous condition, it formerly made a conspicuous figure in the annals of Irish warfare, and the remains of its walls, together with those of many strong castles, ruined monasteries, and decayed churches, still remain to testify its former magnificence. Of this place, as of the ancient Palmyra, it may not be unaptly said; *how are the mighty fallen!* The pitying traveller may sigh, as he passes, at the recollection that here once stood the opulent and splendid Kilmallock. In 1598 it was invested by the Irish, but the Earl of Ormond compelled them to relinquish the siege. In the tumultuous times of 1641 the possession of this town was sharply contested

by the insurgents, whose exertions were totally baffled by the vigilance and military talents of the Lord President Carew. It formerly enjoyed distinctive municipal privileges, and with its extensive liberties constituted a separate county. Its consequence and trade are now annihilated, the shops are few and very small, and all that remains to it is a good inn, where every convenience and accommodation may be obtained. In the immediate neighbourhood of Kilmallock is Mount Coote, the delightful seat of Chidley Coote, esq; there are also several others in the vicinity. Kilmallock has a charter for a market, but it is not held. The fairs are annually on the 21st of February, the 25th of March, on Whit-Tuesday, the 6th of July, the 8th of November, and the 4th of December.

KILRUSH

IN the county of Clare, is distant one hundred and thirty-six miles south-west of Dublin, ninety-two north-west of Cork, forty-two west of Limerick, and eighteen south-west of Eunis, and fourteen south of Milltown. It is a small modern town on the banks of the river Shannon, and its harbour is excellent, possessing every local advantage at a distance of about fourteen miles from the sea. The church is a neat substantial building. Here is also a chapel for Protestant dissenters. The establishment of most notice, is the Kilrush Bathing Hotel, which, for situation, elegance and accommodation, may vie with any in this or the sister kingdom. The market house is situated in the centre of the town, and adds much to its appearance. The court house is an ancient unadorned building, in which are held the sessions of May and October, and the petty sessions once a week. The market is well supplied on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Fairs are held on the 10th of May, and the 12th of October.
