MITCHELSTOWN,

SOMETIMES called Michaelstown, at the northern extremity of the county of Cork, is a post, market and fair town, 103 miles south west of Dublin, 26 north of Cork, 8 north of Fermoy, 40 south east of Limerick, and 14 south west of Cahir. It contains a handsome modern-built church, situated opposite the end of the principal street, and at the entrance into the town from the Cork road. A new Catholic chapel is now erecting on a more extensive scale than the old one, which is not sufficiently commodious for the parishioners. An establishment, called the college, which forms one side of a square, was founded through the munificence of the late Lord Kingston, for the maintenance of 12 decayed gentlemen and sixteen gentlewomen, each of whom is provided with a house and garden, rent and

taxes free, with a salary of 40l. per annum paid quarterly. A chapel also constitutes part of this institution accompanied with a salary of 120l. a year, with a house, offices, and garden for the chaplain. The mansion house at Mitchelstown, the residence of the Kingston family, was lately taken down, on the site of which a most extensive and magnificent structure is now erecting. It is surrounded by a well planted demesne containing about 130 acres. About a mile and a half from the town are the ruins of Cahirdriny castle. There are six annual fairs viz. on the 10th of January, 25th of March, 23d of May, 30th of July, 12th of November, and the 2d of December. The market day is Thursday, when the town bears a tolerably brisk aspect.

POST OFFICE.—Post Master, Mr. Rol art Thornhill. The Dublin Mail, by Cashel, arrives at half past two in the morning, and is despatched at ten at night. The Limerick Mail arrives at eight at night, and leaves at six in the morning. The Cork Mail is due at ten at night, and returns at three in the morning.

NENAGH

Is a market, post, and fair town in the county of Tipperary, 75 miles south-west of Dublin, 19 north-east of Limerick, and on the mail road between them. It is a considerable place upon a river, which flows into Lough Derg, and was formerly defended by a strong castle, called Nenagh Round, the ruins of which are still in existence on one side of Castle-street. In the year 1200, an hospital for canons, observing the rule of St. Augustine, was founded here, and dedicated to St. John the Baptist. It was to be constantly open to the sick and infirm. Theobald Walter, the first Butler in Ireland, liberally endowed this hospital. Queen Elizabeth granted all its possessions to Oliver Grace for ever, for a trifling annual rent by homage and fealty. In the reign of Henry III. a Franciscan friary was founded by the Butler family, and considerable grants were made to it by Lord Thomas de Cantwell. In the year 1550, O'Carroll destroyed both the town and friary, but the garrison preserved the castle. This friary was deemed the richest foundation belonging to the Franciscan order in Ireland.

Queen Elizabeth granted a determinable lease of its estates to Robert Collum for a trifling annual rent. The public buildings are not remarkable; the church is a neat modern structure, and there are a court house, and barracks for infantry. Out of the precincts of the town on the Dublin road is an excellent spring of water, over which is engraved the following inscription in lime-stone.

ERECTED BY LOCAL CONTRIBUTION,
TO COMMEMORATE
The unparalleled benevolence
Of the English Nation
TO THE POOR OF IRELAND,
AT A SEASON OF EXTREME DISTRESS,
A. D. 1822.

The town consists of four streets crossing each other, in the centre of which is the market-place. The market is well attended on Thursdays. Fairs are held on the 24th of April, the 29th of May, the 4th of July, the 4th of September, the 10th of October, and the 1st of November.

POST OFFICE, Castle-street.—Post Master, Mr. Patrick Cane. The Dublin mail arrives every morning at eight, and departs every evening at 20 minutes before six. The Limerick mail is due every evening at five, and leaves every morning at eight.
