**BALLYCONNEL**

IS a brisk little market town, pleasantly situated on the Woodford river, in the county of Cavan, 67 miles north west of Dublin, 9 north east of Ballinamore, 6 west of Belturbet, 7 north of Killyhandra, and 8 south east of Swanlinbar. The church, with its spire, built of stone, in the Gothic order, is a handsome building, and was finished about three years ago; the present rector is the Rev. Joseph Story. The Catholic chapel is situated about half a mile from the town. Sessions are held here for the reco-

very of debts under twenty pounds, twice a year, viz. in April and October. The only charitable institution of Ballyconnel is a dispensary for the sick poor, open on Tuesdays and Saturdays. The market day is Friday, and the fairs are January the 2nd, February the 13th, March the 17th, April the 18th, May the 16th, June the 24th, July the 29th, August the 28th, September the 29th, October the 25th, and December the 3rd. The population is about 450.

**POST OFFICE.**—Post Master, Mr. John Montgomery. The mail for Dublin is despatched at half past two in the afternoon, and returns to Ballyconnel at eleven in the morning; the Belturbet mail arrives and departs at the same time. A mail is despatched to Swanlinbar at eleven in the morning, on Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and another arrives at nine on the same mornings. Letters for England go by the Dublin mail, and those for Scotland by a cross-post to Belfast.

**BALLYMENA,**

A CONSIDERABLE market, post, and fair town in the county of Antrim, is 25 miles north-west of Belfast, 22 south-east of Coleraine, 15 south-east of Ballymoney, and 11 north-north-west of Antrim. It is the property of William Adair, esq. and within the last few years has considerably improved. On the 7th of June, 1798, the rebels took possession of this place, and held it for three days. In 1823, a neat tower was added to the church, which has considerably improved the appearance of the town. Here are two Dissenting meeting houses, and a Methodist chapel. The court-house is a tolerably good building, with a neat tower. Sessions are held twice a year, and a bench of magistrates sits monthly. In the school-house are gratuitously educated a great number

of poor children of both sexes; it was built under the direction of the trustees of Mr. John Guy, who endowed it with sufficient funds for ever; and about two miles south-west of the town is a Moravian establishment. The lands in the neighbourhood are fertile, and the bleaching business is carried on rather extensively. A considerable linen market is held on Saturday, one for the sale of pork on Tuesday, and a grain market on Wednesday. Ballymena lies on the high road from Belfast to Derry and Coleraine, which is the cause of considerable business being transacted in the town. Two fairs are held here, one on the 26th of July, and the other on the 21st of October. The number of houses is 497, and of inhabitants 2960.

**POST OFFICE,** Castle-street.—Post Master, Mr. Samuel M'Master. The Dublin and Belfast Mails are despatched at half-past three in the morning, and arrive at half-past four in the afternoon. The Mail to Broughshane goes at five in the evening, and returns at nine. Office hours from seven in the morning till eleven at night.
