DROMORE

Is a small market town in the county of Down, pleasantly situated on the river Lagan, on the Mail road from Dublin to Belfast, 66 miles north of the former, and 14 south of the latter. It is an ancient episcopal see, founded by St. Colman in the sixth

century. The cathedral is very small, but the interior is handsome. The episcopal residence is a neat, convenient, modern edifice, erected upon an eminence commanding delightful views of the surrounding country, and the grounds belonging to it are well

planted. Dromore contains also two Presbyterian meeting houses, one Methodist, one Covenanters', and one Roman Catholic chapel. Over the Market house, which is a neat building erected on arches, is a room, occasionally used as an assembly room. Considerable quantities of linen yarn are sold on the market and fair days. There is also a school, to which the Dublin society for discountenancing vice allows 15*l.* per annum, and the bishop grants an acre of garden ground. About 200 children of both sexes upon an average attend. Mr. Thomas Magarill is Master; and Mrs. Jane Page, Mistress. An abbey for regular canons was founded here by St. Colman, the site of which is still pointed out. On a hill to the northward of the town is a Danish rath, conspicuous at a great distance. Here is a chalybeate spring deemed efficacious in gravelly complaints. In 1783 the horns of a moose deer were dug up in the see lands, measuring from tip to tip 14 feet four inches, and also the skeleton of the enormous animal that wore them; the former are deposited in the bishop's palace. The surrounding country abounds with curious objects, and numerous coins are continually dug up by labourers, of a date as far back as Edward V. In 1821 several English coins of Henry VIII, and an Irish one of the same reign,

were found in the townland of Skeigh within a mile of the town. Upon making a new line of road a very curious cave was discovered. The depth of this cave from the top to the floor is four feet six inches; the floor is a rectangle, 24 feet in length by two feet six inches in width. The sides, which are perpendicular to the floor, are three feet eight inches high; there is an offset at the top of the wall of four inches, from which the roof springs in the segment of a large circle about three feet below the surface of the rock. On the floor were found several broken urns, formed of coarse clay, and of different dimensions, together with pieces of rotten wood, charcoal, human bones, and those of other animals, a part of each of which is now in the possession of Mr. Welsh of this town. It is obvious that this excavation had been formed in the solid rock with infinite labor to serve as a cemetery for the dead. Dromore has been rendered remarkable for having been under the administration of the eloquent and pious prelates Dr. Jeremy Taylor, and the late admired scholar Doctor Percy. Dromore is governed by a seneschal, William F. Hamilton, esq.; he holds manor courts under the bishop, who, of course, has a considerable property here. The market day is Saturday and there are fairs on the 12th of May and the 10th of October.
