

cents for that purpose. The school house, which is situated in a pleasant and healthy situation, was built by subscription in the year 1802. There is also a large charity school, supported by the ladies and gentlemen of Newry, for the education of 180 children of both sexes; the scriptures are read as a class book, and no distinction made as to religious principles. This school is also conducted on the Lancasterian system; it is at present held in a room over the market house, but it is in contemplation to erect a school-house better suited for the purpose, and the funds for accomplishing so desirable an object, or part of them, will be received from the Kildare-street society. The public buildings are the custom-house, the court-house in Hill-street, the sessions-house and gaol in Ballybought, the Newry bridewell, and a small, but neat theatre in Hill-street. The house, containing the news room and ball room, was built by several gentlemen of the town and neighbourhood in 1791, and it is supplied with a variety of newspapers and other publications; the exchange is held in it every Thursday, and it is open to all strangers. The consequence of Newry is best ascertained by its

commerce; this is very considerable, and may be partly attributable to the excellence of the navigation, and partly to the geographical situation of the town, which is naturally connected with several flourishing counties. The duties on exports and imports for the year ending January 1824 amounted to 58,738*l.* 3*s.* 8*d.* and it has greatly exceeded that sum in many years preceding: the excise duties, it is supposed, average about 60,000*l.* a year. The markets are large and extremely well attended, and there is an immense quantity of unbleached linen bought and sold on market days. Newry is governed by a seneschal, and sends one member to the imperial parliament; Lord Viscount Newry is the present member. This town is rapidly improving; it is extremely well regulated, being lighted with gas, the streets kept clean and well paved, and passengers are not subject to the annoyance of beggars, as the poor are otherwise provided for by the liberality of the inhabitants. The market is held weekly on Thursday, and there are two large annual fairs, viz. on the first of May, and the first of November. The population is estimated at 13,500.

POST OFFICE, Hill-street.—*Post Master*, John Higginson, esq.—*Deputy Post Master*, Mr. Moore. The Dublin Mail arrives every morning at four, and every afternoon at half-past three, and is despatched at ten in the morning, and at a quarter before ten at night.
