**ACADEMIES.**

**FEINAIGLIAN INSTITUTION, Circular Road, North Lower Gloucester-street.**

This Institution was formed by Subscription in the year 1813, for the purpose of establishing and perpetuating the System of Education introduced by the late PROFESSOR FEINAIGLE VON LUXEMBOURG. Under this System instruction is conveyed to the understanding by habitual exercise of the reasoning powers, thereby more perfectly developing the intellectual faculties, and materially abridging the period of time usually devoted to School Education. To give due effect to this system, and to conduct it on a suitable scale, Aldborough House has been made the principal Seminary, and fitted up at an expence exceeding 15,000*l.* for the reception of Boarders, from the age of seven to fourteen years. A Day School has also been established at Rossmore House, Kildare-street. These establishments are vested in Trustees.

The Affairs of the Institution are managed by a Committee chosen from and by the Proprietors, who derive no other benefit from their Shares, than the privilege of admitting a Pupil on Terms somewhat lower than those paid by the Public. The Committee meet each Friday at Luxembourg (late Aldborough House) and the first Monday in each month at Rossmore House.

Half-yearly Examinations of the Pupils, in the various objects of study, are publicly held at Luxembourg and Rossmore House, in June and December; and a half-yearly Report is published at the same time, of the progress of the Institution.
