

ATHBOY,

AN improving market and post town in the county of Meath, is situated twenty-eight miles north-west of Dublin, six north-west of Trim, six south-west of Kells, and nine south-west of Navan. It is the property of the Earl Darnley, and was formerly a borough. The town consists of one main street, which is clean and spacious. It contains a modern-built church and tower, a Roman Catholic chapel, a market house, and two schools supported by the Darnley family. Athboy is very pleasantly situated,

and is surrounded by the respectable residences of Francis Gannon, esq, Francis Hopkins, esq, Francis Walsh, esq, and the Rev. Robert Tronson, which add much to the beauty of the town.

The extensive flour mills of Mr. Leech encourage a good corn market, which is held on Thursday, and four fairs held on the 23rd of February, the 4th of May, the 4th of August, and the 7th of November, give additional importance to the place. The population is about 2,000.

POST OFFICE.—Post Master, Mr. John Askin. The Dublin Mail arrives at half past seven in the morning, from the first of April till the first of October, and is despatched at six in the evening; from the first of October till the first of April it arrives at nine in the morning, and is despatched at four in the afternoon. COACHES, &c.

KILLESHANDRA and GRANARD Day Coach departs for Dublin on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, at half past eleven in the morning, and returns on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, at the same hour.

ATHLONE

IS an ancient market and post town, 60 miles west of Dublin and 23 south-west of Mullingar. The noble river Shannon, which rolls its pure stream through the town, divides the counties of Roscommon and Westmeath, as well as the provinces of Leinster and Connaught, so that Athlone is partly in all the four. It is situated nearly in the centre of the Kingdom, therefore its barracks, whence succours may be sent to any invaded or turbulent quarter, have been greatly enlarged, and the surrounding heights adequately fortified; their situation is extremely healthy, as they lie on the western bank of the river, and they are sufficiently spacious for the accommodation of 3600 soldiers. The two parts

of the town are connected by a long, narrow, and ancient bridge of stone. It is a large corn-mart, vast quantities of grain being consumed by two extensive distilleries, a brewery, and by the mills in the town and neighbourhood. The places of worship here are two churches, two Catholic chapels, and two meeting houses, besides two convents. The place is inhabited by respectable shopkeepers and dealers, and carries on a considerable inland trade. The market days are Tuesdays and Saturdays, and fairs are held four times in the year, viz. on the first Monday after old twelfth-day, on the 21st of March, the 30th of May, and the first Monday in September. Population about 12000.

POST OFFICE, King-street.—Post Mistress, Mrs. Ann Burrows. The Dublin Mail arrives every morning at 10 minutes before seven, by the Galway Mail, and is despatched every evening at 10 minutes before seven. The Mail goes to Roscommon by horse at 20 minutes after seven every morning. Office hours from seven in the morning till Eleven at night.
