**COACHES, &c.**

The Galway Mail for Dublin, leaves the Swan Inn, Church-street, at Seven in the evening, through Moat, Kilbeggan, Kinpegad and Leixlip, and returns for Galway at 47 minutes after six in the morning, through Ballinasloe and Loughrea. The Day Coach arrives at half-past seven in the morning, by the same route as the Mail, and returns for Ballinasloe at 59 minutes after four in the afternoon. The Grand Canal Coach goes from the Office, Church-st,

daily, at half-past four, to Tuillamore, to meet the Packet, and returns to Athlone, at eight in the morning. The Royal Canal Car goes from Mr. John Daly's, Dublin gate, every day at 40 minutes past twelve, to Tuam Bridge, to meet the Royal Canal Packet and returns to Athlone daily, at one.

**CONVEYANCE**

**By Water.**

**ATHY,**

AN ancient town and borough in the county of Kildare, pleasantly situated on the banks of the river Barrow, 32 miles south west of Dublin, 11 east of Mayborough, and 10 north of Carlow. Across the Ford at this place, Donough O'Brien retreated after the famous battle of Clontarf. At the foot of the bridge stands the Castle, now occupied as a Gaol; it was erected in 1575, for the defence of the town. Here are the remains of two monasteries, and an establishment for friars, which was founded by the Wogan family, in the year 1253. The church is a neat edifice, and the tholsel and market-house is a handsome and spacious stone building, well adapted for the purpose of its erection. The charitable institutions of this town are a dispensary, and a school supported by subscription. Athy is, alternately with Naas, the assize town for the county, and solely the

property of the Duke of Leinster. Few towns are so well situated as this is, for commercial intercourse, as the grand canal runs up the town, by means of which goods may be conveyed to all parts of the kingdom; and at the east end of the town, all the roads, converging from different parts of the county, concentrate. In the year 1615 James I. granted a charter, by which he constituted the market town of Athy a borough, to be governed by a sovereign, two bailiffs, twelve burgesses, and a common council. One of the best corn markets in the county is held here, on Tuesdays and Saturdays; there are also six annual fairs, viz. on the 17th of March, the 25th of April, the 9th of June, the 25th of July, the 10th of October, and the 11th of December. The population is 3276.

**BALLINAKILL,**

A MARKET and post town in the Queen's county, 49 miles south west of Dublin, and 14 north of Kilkenny, prior to the union sent two members to the Irish parliament, and had formerly a very considerable woollen trade, which is greatly fallen away. The town stands on the estate of Earl Stanhope. On approaching the town by the Dublin road, the stranger is attracted by the very neat, modern-built church and steeple, erected in the year 1821; the eastern window is very curious. Adjoining to the church is that very fine edifice the Roman Catholic chapel. The ruins of the old castle are also an object of attention. In November, 1643, the siege of Cullohil was undertaken by General Preston, and after the surrender of that fortress the Irish army proceeded

to Ballinakill, and sat down before this castle with two pieces of heavy ordnance, which were landed at Waterford and conveyed by one Jeffery Baron, a priest, to Ballinakill. The first fire from these guns so terrified the garrison, that a parley was beaten, and terms were granted the besieged to have safe conveyance to Monastereven, the head quarters of Sir Charles Coote.—A good market is held on Saturday, and there are seven fairs in the year; that held on the 16th of November is famous for bullocks. The other fair days are the 22nd of March, the 22nd of April, the 12th of August, the 16th of October, the 16th of December, and the first Thursday after Whitsuntide. Population about 2500.

**BALLYMORE,**

A POST and market town, 50 miles west of Dublin, 12 north east of Athlone, and 12 south west of Mullingar, is in the barony of Recondra, and county of Westmeath. The town now consists of one long street, of no very elegant appearance, but was formerly a place of considerable note, being one of the oldest post towns in Ireland. At present

the only public building is the Catholic chapel. The neighbourhood is extremely pleasant, and the land very fertile. A market is held for butter on Friday, and there are two fairs in the year, one on Whit-Monday, and the other on the 14th of October. Population about 500.
