DURROW

IS a small post and fair town, fifty-two miles south-west of Dublin, thirteen north-west of Kilkenny, eleven south-east of Monrath, and seventy-two north-east of Cork. This town with its estates was formerly part of the Queen's county, but, on coming into the possession of the Butler family, who were perpetually harassed by the adherents of the Fitzpatrick, the Earl of Ormond procured an act of parliament to make Durrow with its appurtenances part of the county of Kilkenny, although surrounded by the Queen's county. A large square, which stands in the centre of the town, contains the post-office, several spacious houses, and a modern-built stone church with a steeple and one bell; hard by is a small but neat Catholic chapel with a school, to which Lord Viscount Ashbrook annually contributes five pounds. The river Erkna, on which is situated one of the largest flour mills in the kingdom, the property of Wm. Delany, esq, skirts the northern boundary of the town. The population, including the parish, is about 1950. The fairs are on the 2nd Thursday in May, the 2nd Thursday in August (old style), and on the 21st of November.
