LONGFORD

IS situated in a valley, 58 miles north west of Dublin, 12 west of Granard, 7 north west of Edgeworth's town, and 10 north of Ballymahon. It is the county town, and previous to the union, sent members to parliament. Here is a neat church, with a spire, of the Grecian order, erected in 1821, a Roman Catholic chapel, two Methodist meeting houses, an artillery barrack, a barrack for a company of foot, a court house built in 1796, and a new gaol of the Grecian order, now building. On the site of ground, at present occupied as a barrack, once stood the castle of Longford, and near to it an extensive abbey. There is a diocesan school, under the direction of the Rev. George Irwin, whose salary is paid by the bishop and

clergy of the diocese. There are also a savings' bank, to which Lord Longford is patron, a county infirmary, and several schools, supported by subscription. The town of Longford contains two principal streets, which are clean and spacious, with others of minor importance; its municipal government is vested in a sovereign and his deputy. The prosperity of Longford is greatly assisted by its being on the high road to Sligo, by its extensive market, which is held on Saturday, for linen, corn, butter, &c. and by two annual fairs, which are kept on the 10th of June, and the 16th of October. The population, according to the last census, was 4500.

**POST OFFICE,** Main-street.—Post Master, Mr. William Boyle. The Dublin mail is despatched at six minutes past six in the evening by the Sligo mail, and arrives at seven in the morning. The Lanesborough mail is despatched by horse at half-past seven in the morning, and returns at a quarter before six in the evening. Office hours from seven in the morning till eleven at night.

LUCAN,

IN the county of Dublin, is a small town on the high road to Galway, seven miles west of Dublin, three north east of Celbridge, and ten north east of Naas. It is the property of Colonel Vesey, who resides here. The river Liffy, over which is a neat stone bridge, passes the town. An extensive linen manufactory, and an iron foundry, afford employ-ment to the neighbouring poor. A new church was erected in 1822, which possesses considerable beauty and a lofty spire. Here are also a Roman Catholic chapel, and a dispensary, which is supported by subscription. Lucan is celebrated for a chalybeate spa, which is very much frequented in the summer season, being deemed an efficacious remedy for cutaneous eruptions, and various other diseases. Here is neither market nor fair. Population about 400.
