MULLINGAR,

THE county town of West Meath, is situated thirty-nine miles west of Dublin, twenty-four north-east of Athlone, and twenty south-east of Longford. It consists of one main street, with others of minor importance branching from it. On the north and south sides of the town are fine lakes, each several miles in circumference. Here is an extensive barrack capable of holding a thousand men; it is a handsome building, and adds much to the beauty of the town. The other public buildings are the church, which is a modern edifice with a spire; the Catholic chapel, a Methodist meeting house, the market house, the gaol and court house, and the infirmary. The sessions and assizes are held here, and there is a weekly manor court

for the recovery of small debts. The canal, by which an easy intercourse is kept up with the metropolis, nearly encircles the town. Mullingar is a vicarage, and before the union sent members to the Irish parliament. It is governed by a seneschal. The land in the neighbourhood is extremely fertile. Mullingar depends much on an extensive market which is held on Thursdays, and on four annual fairs, held on the 4th of July, the 11th of November, the 6th of April, and the 29th of August. The population is about 4,000.
