

to Enniscorthy, a distance of 12 miles, adds much to the commercial convenience of the town. Wexford was one of the earliest colonies of the English, and the first forces from England, that attempted the conquest of Ireland, landed here under Fitz-stephens and Fitzger. Id. At this town King Henry II. embarked for England after receiving homage from most of the Kings and Princes of this nation, and here the marriage ceremony was performed between Raymond, afterwards viceroy of Ireland, and the lady Basil, sister to Strongbow, Earl of Pembroke; it was also the second town that Cromwell besieged. On the site of the old castle, which stood on a rocky hill that overlooks the town, barracks are erected for a company of foot soldiers. There are several parts of the old walls of Wexford standing, and the gates yet remain. The town consists of one long street with some lanes on each side, and contains many handsome buildings. There are several ruins of ancient abbeys and religious houses. The public buildings are the church, the market house, the court house, where there are sessions twice a year; and the county gaol, where the assizes are held in Spring and Summer. Besides the established church, the place contains a Roman Catholic, and a Methodist chapel, a nunnery, a Catholic college, a Lancasterian free school, a subscription news-room, a house of industry and lunatic asylum, a county infirmary and fever hospital. Near the west gate is a small structure over a mineral well, which they call a spa, but the appear-

ance of the water, being covered with an oily scum, is not very inviting, though it has many virtues attributed to it. The chief exports of Wexford are corn, live cattle, salt beef and pork, bacon, hogs, linen and malt; the imports are slates, coals, tiles and earthenware. Provisions are plentiful and cheap, and fine wild fowl may be had from the month of November to May. The trade of the town is considerable, and its commerce with England is great. On the 30th of May, 1798, it was entirely evacuated by the troops, on account of the appearance of the insurgents, who were become 20,000 strong, and threatened to attack it; they shortly after entered, and held possession of it till the 21st of June. In the barony of Forth, adjoining to Wexford, are the descendants of an ancient British colony, who came over with Henry II. These people retain their native language, and many singular customs to this day. They intermarry among themselves, and have intermixed little or none with the natives. Here, it is probable, the ancient British or Celtic language has been preserved in greater purity, than even in Britain; the inhabitants are cleanly in the extreme, and possessed of great simplicity of manners. Wexford is governed by a mayor, recorder and bailiffs, and sends one member to parliament. The fairs are March the 17th, May the 1st, June the 29th, August the 24th, and November the 1st for cattle and wool. Market days Wednesday and Saturday.—The population in 1822 was 11,389.
